Q) What are the 5 poverty alleviation programs?

Microfinance initiatives: Providing small loans to individuals or small businesses in low-income communities to empower entrepreneurship and self-employment.

Conditional cash transfer programs: Offering financial assistance to low-income families, contingent upon fulfilling certain conditions such as sending children to school or attending health check-ups.

Vocational training programs: Offering skills development and job training to unemployed or underemployed individuals to enhance their employability and income potential.

Food assistance programs: Providing food aid or subsidies to ensure that vulnerable populations have access to nutritious meals, thereby reducing hunger and improving health outcomes.

Affordable housing initiatives: Implementing programs to increase access to safe and affordable housing for low-income families, including subsidies, low-interest loans, or housing vouchers.
